

### Self-Recorded Video Guidelines

# **Application Process**

Musicians interested in applying must first complete the <u>Application Form</u>. Upon submission, you will receive a second form via email.

- Self-Recording Applicants: Use the second form to input details about your repertoire and upload your audition video.
- Live Audition Applicants: Even if auditioning live with an ESYO proctor, you must complete the second form to provide repertoire details. However, you do not need to upload a video—your audition will be recorded and submitted on your behalf.

# **Recording Guidelines**

You may record your video using any available tool (e.g., smartphone) and in any suitable location (e.g., home).

### **Video Requirements**

Your audition video must be **unedited** and recorded in a **single take**, including:

- Solo Piece: 1–3 minutes in length (you may select the best section of your solo).
- **Scale:** A scale appropriate for your playing ability that demonstrates your range on the instrument.
- Excerpts: Excerpt(s) that best align with your current level of skill and experience. <u>Click here to</u> <u>find your instrument's excerpts</u>. To be considered for only Concertino Strings or Wind Orchestra, prepare only the single excerpt for that ensemble
  - To be considered **only** for Concertino Strings or Wind Orchestra, prepare the designated excerpt for that ensemble.
  - Repertory Jazz applicants do not need to submit excerpts.

**Editing is strictly prohibited.** Videos showing evidence of cuts, splicing, pitch manipulation, or other alterations will be disqualified. The entire audition must be recorded in one continuous take.

# Video & Audio Quality

- Maximum file size: **5 GB**
- Preferred format: High-quality internet video resolution (not required but recommended)
- Accepted file formats: WMV, MTS, OGG, MPEG4, 3GPP, MOV, AVI, FLV, WebM, MPEGPS (Ensure compatible codecs: H.264/MPEG4 video; AAC/MP3 audio)

### **Camera Positioning & Framing**

- Fixed camera position throughout the recording.
- Clear visibility of your face, instrument, fingerings, bow, and embouchure.
- Avoid obstructing the view with a music stand.



#### Instrument-Specific Framing:

- Violin/Viola: Recorded from the side to clearly capture bowing and left-hand technique.
- Cello/Bass: Recorded from an angled right-side view (often 45 degrees) to ensure visibility of both hands and bow movement.
- Ensure the entire instrument and player are visible in the frame.
- Winds & Brass: Face the camera with the full instrument in view, including embouchure and fingers.
  - **French horns**: Record from the **right side** so hand placement is visible.

### Accompaniment

- No accompanist is permitted.
- Jazz auditions: Play-along tracks are allowed but optional.

### **Before You Start Recording**

Clearly announce the following **before** playing each section:

- 1. Your Name
- 2. Solo Piece Title (before performing it)
- 3. Scale Name (before playing it)
- 4. Excerpt Title(s) (before performing each one)

# Final Steps Before Uploading

Check your file to ensure it plays correctly. V Follow naming requirements (e.g., FirstName\_LastName\_Instrument). V Ensure accessibility if using a cloud service (e.g., adjust Google Drive settings to allow judges to view your file).
